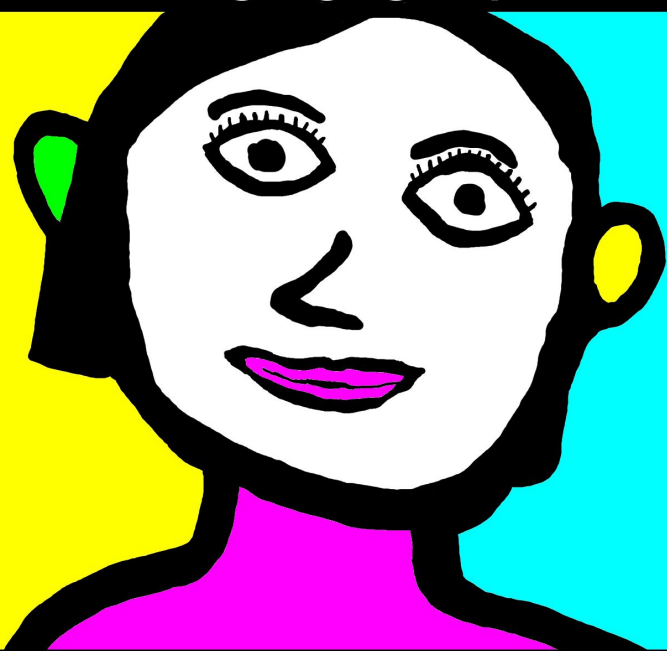

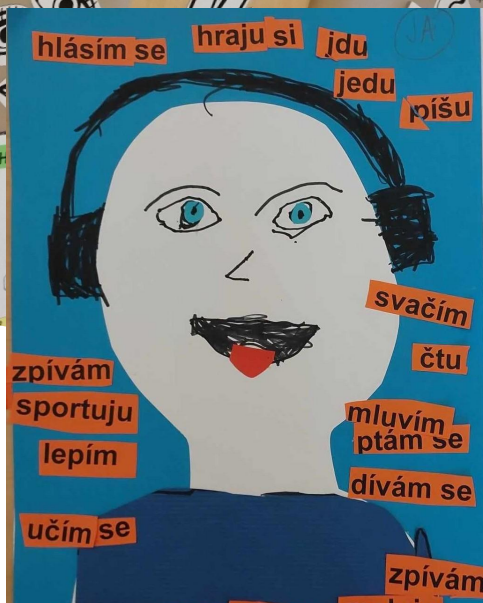
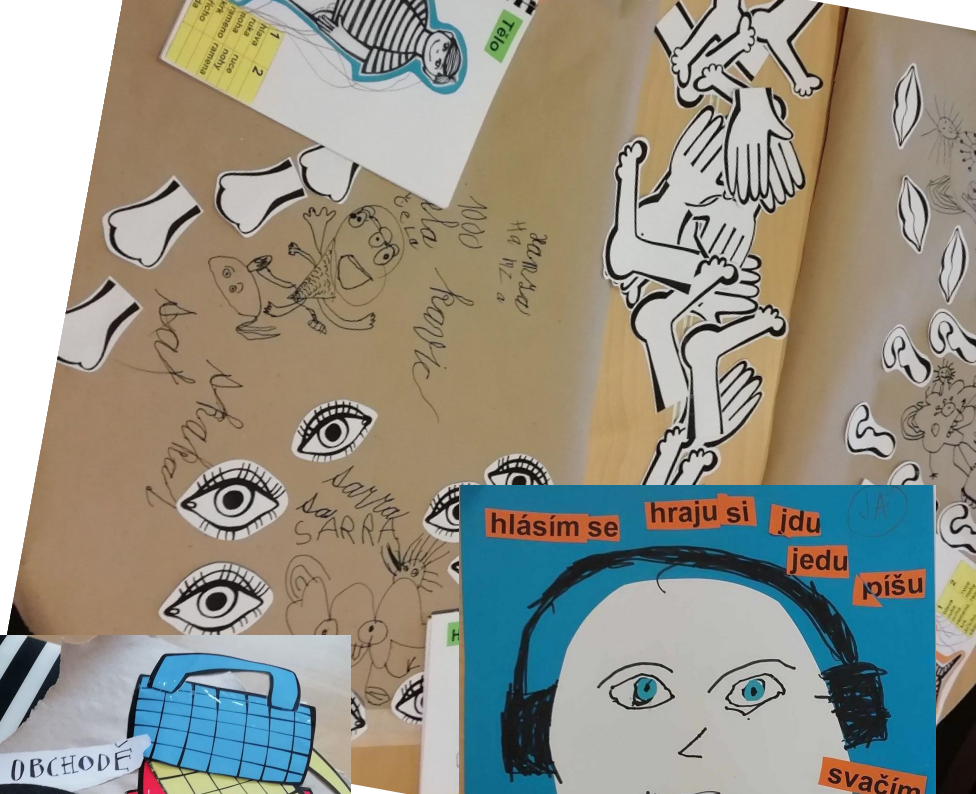

Course Topic

“Little kids-Big world” is common theme for all summer courses.

Our world is full of people, animals and things. We will talk together about it in Czech. We will create and play games.

The program will be adjusted according to the age and language level of children that will meet in a particular week.

Topic is suitable for **preschoolers** and **schoolers** (grades 1–4) as well.

The programme will not be repeated during the summer.



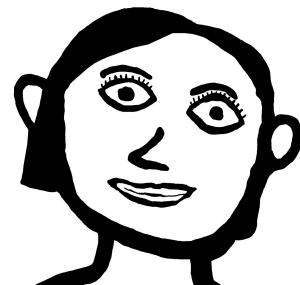


What Awaits the Children?



- Fun games with Czech texts, letters, words, and pictures
- Creation of simple children's crafts
- Movement games indoors or outdoors
- Friendship-building activities

Activities will vary depending on the **age** and **language level** of the children.





Czech for Preschoolers

Fluency in Czech is not the goal for little foreigners before starting primary school. Since Czech is not their native language, the focus is on ensuring they **feel comfortable using it at school**. This **helps them become independent in doing homework** without parental assistance.

At kindergarten age, children's Czech language skills are usually similar:

- They have a **basic vocabulary**
- They can use all **three Czech tenses** (past, present, future)
- They can form **simple sentences**
- They **do not yet know** how to **decline nouns** and **adjectives**
- They **use pronouns** and numerals **sparingly**

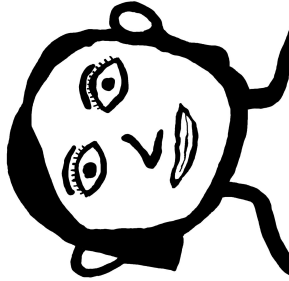


If their Czech reaches **this level**, it is a **great foundation**. Their proficiency will improve naturally during their schooling.

Essential Skills for Preschoolers Entering First Grade

Before starting primary school, every child should have developed:

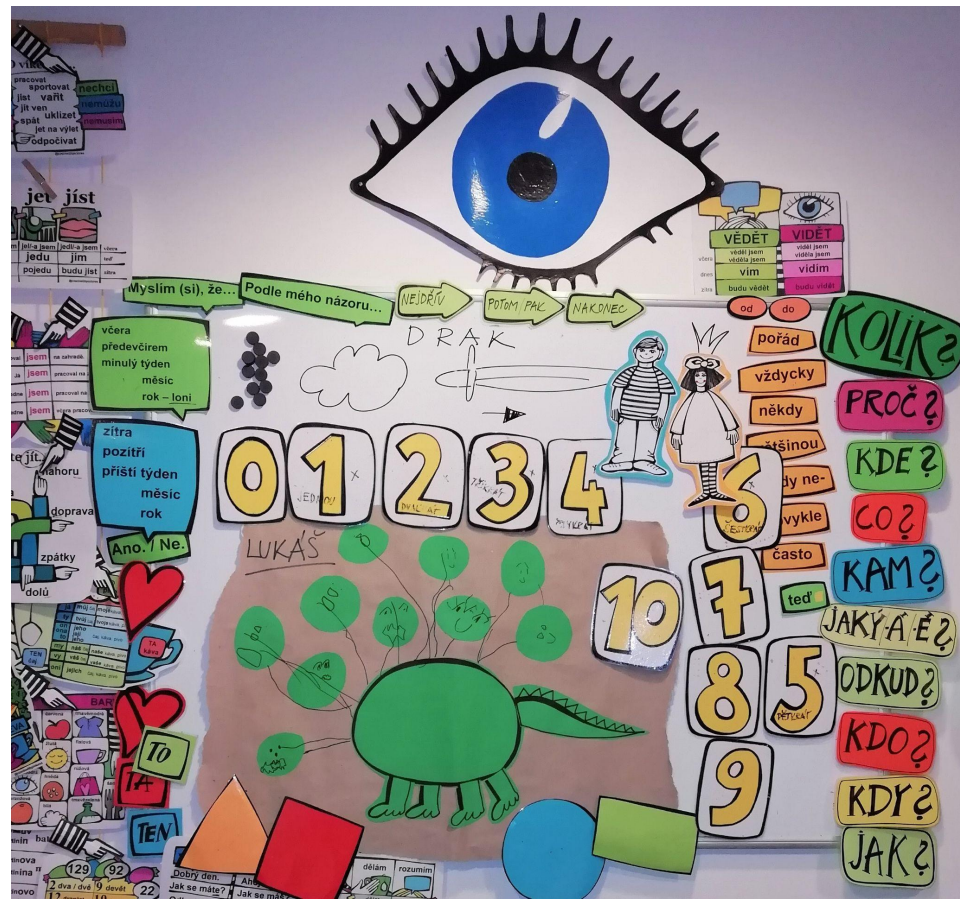
- **Speech skills** (vocabulary and pronunciation)
- **Graphomotor skills** (hand relaxation exercises, proper pencil grip)
- **Auditory perception** (analysis, synthesis, differentiation, rhythm, memory)
- **Visual perception** (differentiation, analysis, synthesis, memory)
- **Spatial awareness and orientation**
- **Basic number sense, colors, and shapes**
- **Social competence** (self-confidence, communication with peers)



Czech for Schoolers Starting in September 2025

Children make significant progress in Czech during their first year of school.

- The first three months are structured gradually to help them adapt.
- Over time, they learn to write fluently and read with understanding.
- It is beneficial if they already understand Czech well enough to follow teachers' instructions and complete homework independently.



Czech for Schoolers

School-aged children need to learn Czech quickly and use it actively to:

- **Understand** the curriculum across all subjects
- **Follow** teachers' instructions
- **Communicate confidently** and openly with peers

Reading comprehension is key to their success.

- It helps them strengthen **their grammar**.
- It expands **their vocabulary**.
- It enables them to process and **work with information effectively**.

The ultimate goal is to become proficient in Czech.



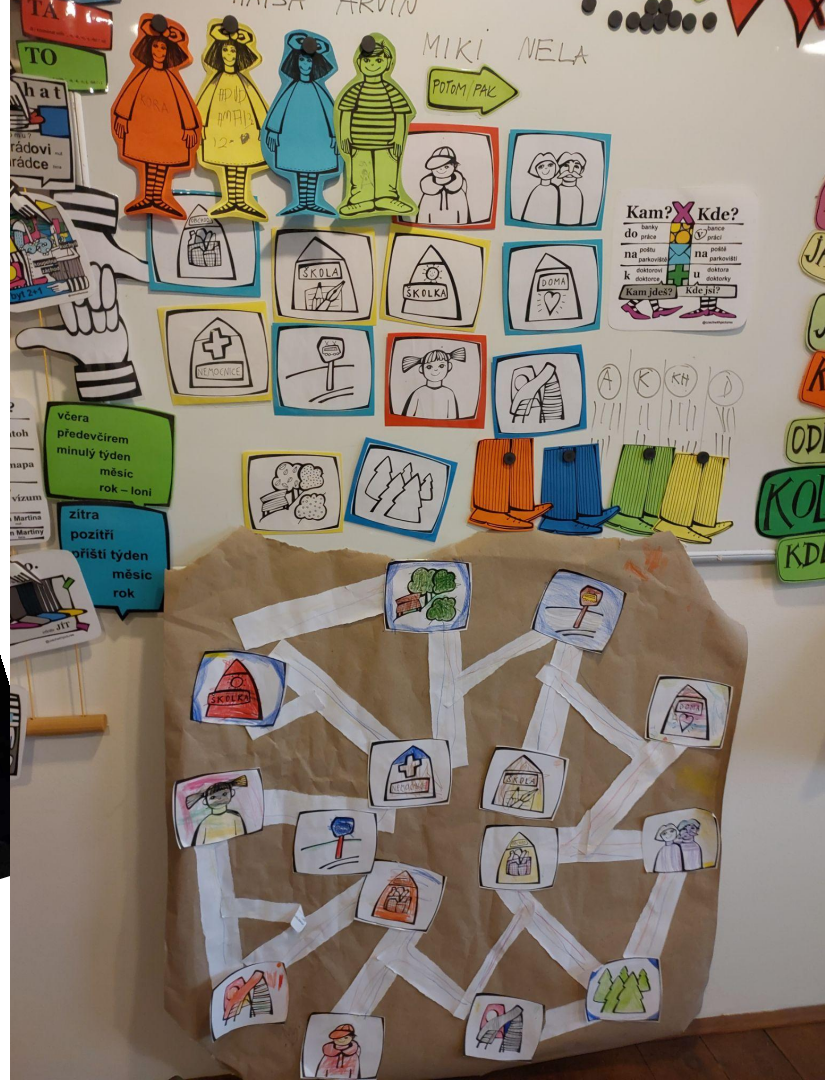
What Kids Love on the Lessons

Creativity

Creativity is a powerful tool for practicing these activities and the Czech language simultaneously.

Children create a simple art project during each lesson. The goal is not to create a perfect picture but to practice their Czech and other skills preschoolers need, through creative techniques. **Creativity is a child's natural path to learning.**







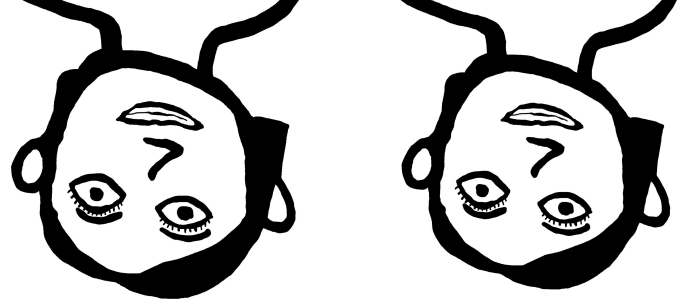
Games

Children enjoy **changing activities** frequently and **playing games**.

- **Simple movement games** complement creative activities.
- These games **provide natural opportunities to speak Czech**.
- Activities take place both **in the studio or in the natural environment**.



Friendship



With only **3–4 children** per group, **children feel safe** and comfortable **expressing themselves.**

The activities encourage them to listen to others and understand that **friendship is valuable.**
